TEXAS Health and Human Services

The automatic renewal of Texas Medicaid coverage (continuous Medicaid) ended on March 31, 2023. Recipients will once again need to renew their benefits to ensure coverage will continue, if eligible.

Recipients of Texas Medicaid will need to renew/update their information. Renewal information from HHSC will either be mailed in a yellow envelope that says "Action Required" (in red), or sent electronically if they have a Your Texas Benefits account.

The Community Healthcore Foundation invites you to become a Youth Mental Health First Aider!

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who regularly interact with young people. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders.

Trainings are provided FREE to the community through the Community Healthcore Foundation - Timothy Stewart Memorial for Suicide Prevention and Awareness.
