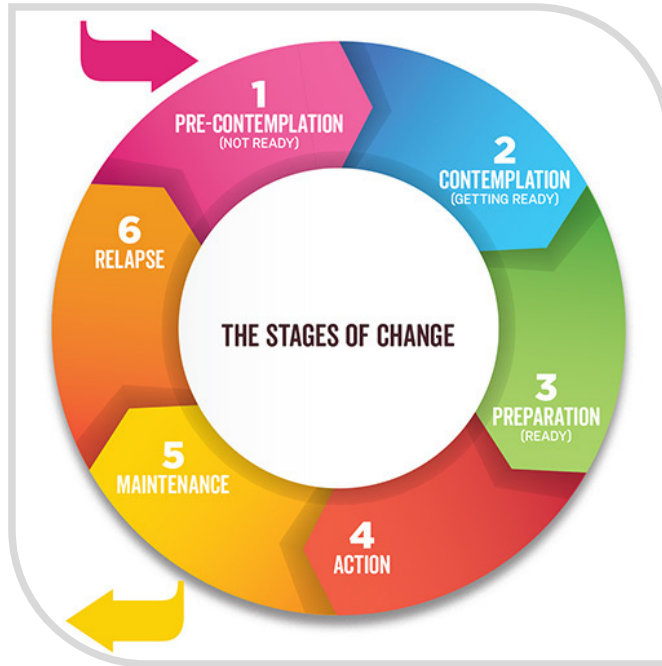

HOW TO BEGIN?

Call our office to schedule an appointment. Our staff will be happy to assist you.

On your first appointment, the Intake Specialist will provide a description of our program services. They will also conduct a financial eligibility assessment to determine the cost of treatment and your payment options. A Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor (LCDC) will conduct a clinical screening and assessment to identify your strengths and limitations regarding your goals. The counselor will discuss recommended treatment options and offer you the opportunity to participate in treatment, with appropriate referrals and case management.

PRIORITY POPULATION

In order to qualify for COPSD services, individuals must be 18 years old or older and meet one or more of the following criteria. Community Healthcore shall give preference for treatment services in the following HHSC established order of priority:

1. Pregnant injecting individuals
2. Pregnant substance users
3. Injecting drug users
4. Individuals identified as being at high risk for overdose
5. Individuals referred by the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS)
6. Individuals experiencing homelessness or housing instability
7. All other populations
